
Protecting the Most Important Physical Asset... You!!!



Luggage Tags

- If front desk says your room number out loud, ask to be reassigned.




Elevators


Cell Phone

Daily Check-in

- Leave your daily schedule with someone who will be checking.
 Arrange check-in times so if something happens, they will be alerted to it right away.
- If that person is back at home, be sure you've given them someone to contact, to include the local police department. However, sometimes police departments are unreliable and possibly corrupt.




Active Shooter

- Run if you can. **Hide if you can't run.** Fight if you have to. **However, if possible don't hide in a place or way that prevents** you from fighting if found. If you can get 15 ft. between you and a shooter, run and keep running.
- If involved in a shooting and you incorporate Run/Hide/ Fight.... put cell phone on silent or airplane mode (not vibrate). Noise gets you killed. You can quickly put in normal mode when time comes to call for help.
- New trend combining bombs and shooting (Paris attack).
- The best thing you can do for bombings in airports, malls, etc.. is too realize that it may be followed up with shooter(s). Put distance and walls between you and blasts/threat.

Emergency Rendezvous Point

 Have a place meet up in the event something happens and families or travel partners need to scatter, everyone will know where to link back up in the event there is no communication with one another. Always make the ERP a public place.




Parking and Parking Lots

- Try to park your car nose facing out in the parking lot for a quick departure if confronted. It's difficult to back up in a hurry, and if your attacked while getting in your car, the assailant is the "V" of the door and will be swept into the car with you if you try to reverse first. This is an important rule for women as women are frequently assaulted by rapists just as they get into cars in parking lots.
- Always know where you parked. If parking in the daylight, look for the lights and park under them. They will be on when you come out at night.
- In a parking lot, walk down the center of the driving lanes. **You're** less likely to be hit by someone who happens to be driving up the lane than you are from someone hiding to the far side of cars as you walk past and cannot see them.


Accosted

- The universal sign of submission is to look down and away when eye contact is made.
 - People who project confidence are less likely to be a victim of a crime.
 - Fear attracts violence; confidence deters it.
 - If something doesn't feel right, it probably isn't. Trust your gut and act on it.
 - Know the phone and address of the nearest United States Embassy and/or consult.
- Don't use public WIFI.
