Global Entertainment Giants Form Massive Anti-Piracy Coalition

Some of the world's largest entertainment groups have formed a huge coalition with a mission to reduce online piracy. The Alliance for Creativity and Entertainment is comprised of 30 companies including the studios of the MPAA, Amazon, Netflix, CBS, HBO, BBC, Sky, Bell Canada, CBS, Hulu, Lionsgate, Foxtel, Village Roadshow, and many more.

It's not unusual for companies within the same area of business to collaborate in order to combat piracy. The studios and labels that form the MPAA and RIAA, for example, have doing just that for decades.



Today, however, an unprecedented number of global content creators and distribution platforms have announced the formation of a brand new coalition to collaboratively fight Internet piracy on a global scale.

It's likely that the creation of ACE will go down as a landmark moment in the fight against piracy. Never before has such a broad coalition promised to pool resources on such a grand and global scale. That being said, with great diversity comes the potential for greatly diverging opinions, so only time will tell if this coalition can really hold together.

THE PROBLEM

- Individuals are selling streaming media players (**preloaded** with infringing add-ons or apps) or subscription services that provide infringing **live and on-demand film/TV content**
- Exploitation of consumers who may not understand the unlawful nature of the devices/apps or the associated malware risks
- Quality and ease of use – “**plug & play**”
- Preloaded media players are offered for sale via reputable **e-commerce platforms** as well as highly professional looking third-party websites
- Those who purchase devices or pay for subscription services are **willing to pay for content**

- We are seeing a movement toward **subscription services and retransmission sites** that do not require a device (based on disruption?)
- Rise in subscription services and device sellers using **end to end IPTV and VOD products/services** that they can then customize with their brand (new business model around this form of piracy)

- October 2017, case filed against TickBox TV, the seller of piracy devices that advertised free and easy access to unauthorized movies and television shows

- ACE plaintiffs filed for a preliminary injunction
- On January 30, the Court issued a preliminary injunction (*Universal City Studios Prods. LLLP v. TickBox TV LLC*, No. CV 17-7496-MWF (ASx), 2018 U.S. Dist. LEXIS 40756 (C.D. Cal. Jan. 30, 2018)):
 - “There is sufficient evidence that the Device can be and is used to access infringing content, and there is sufficient evidence of TickBox’s **fault** – primarily in the form of its advertisements and customer-support efforts.”
- On February 13, the Court issued a revised preliminary injunction based on a stipulation of the parties requiring TickBox to take a number of steps to disable access to unauthorized motion pictures and television programs, including, issuing an update to its software that automatically downloads and installs on any previously distributed TickBox devices that deletes or disables access to the previously installed apps that link to unauthorized performances (i.e., a kill switch)

- In September, pursuant to a settlement, the parties stipulated to a permanent injunction and judgment
- The judgment provides:
 - Final judgment for damages (**\$25M**) and a permanent injunction are entered for Plaintiffs on all Causes of Action (i.e., for intentional inducement of copyright infringement and contributory infringement)
- The permanent injunction orders that defendants:
 - Not to curate any menu of “builds,” “themes,” “apps,” “addons” or other software program that TickBox knows or has reason to know links to pirated content
 - Not to encourage or assist others in locating, uploading, downloading or installing software that TickBox knows or has reason to know links to pirated content
 - Not to take any action to circumvent the permanent injunction or the preliminary injunctions’ requirement that TickBox limit the ability of users to use the TickBox device or software
 - To remove, or disable access through its menus to, software that link to pirated content or that Plaintiffs may, in the future, identify as linking to pirated content

- Case against Dragon Box Media, its operator, and a reseller, launched January, 2018
- Defendants market and sell “Dragon Box,” a curated computer hardware device that they urge customers to use as a tool for the mass infringement
- Dragon Media’s president actively recruited resellers to join his team and one is named in the action

- In April, ACE filed a third US civil litigation against Setvnow (Set Broadcast), which offers an IPTV subscription service and previously sold a preloaded set top box.
- Following our action and an action by Dish, Setvnow took its service offline.



- After identifying the developers behind the popular repositories and add-ons, ACE delivered cease and desist letters to those individuals in person
